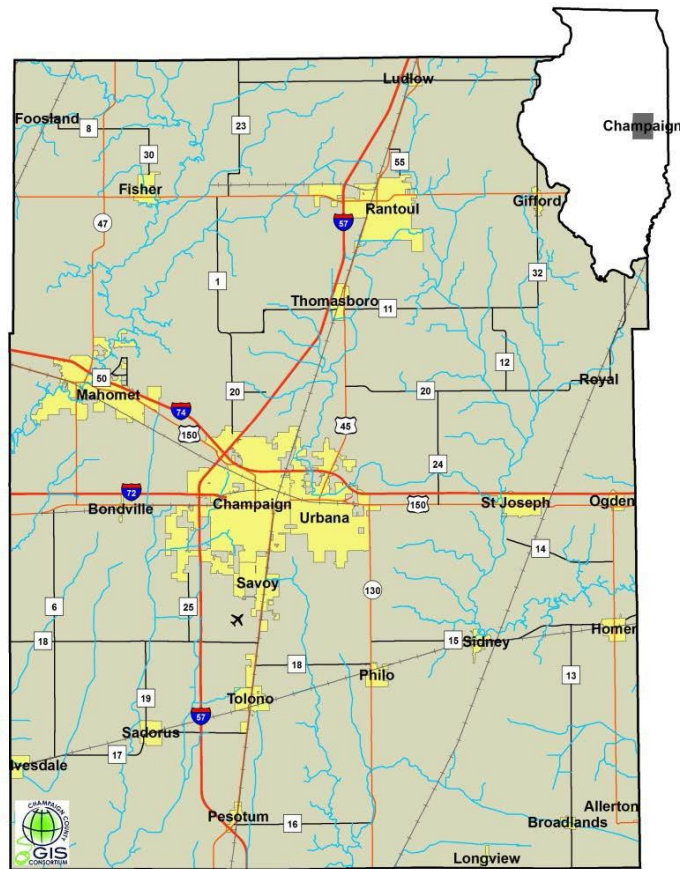


ABOUT CHAMPAIGN COUNTY



Champaign County, Illinois is located in the heart of east-central Illinois, approximately 136 miles south of Chicago and 86 miles east northeast of Springfield, the state capital. Champaign County is home to the University of Illinois, Parkland College, and two major regional hospitals; it is comprised of 998 square miles, and 90.5% of its land area is utilized for agriculture.

Champaign County was organized in 1833, having been previously a part of Vermilion County. The county and county seat were named for Champaign County, Ohio and Urbana, Ohio, respectively, the home of the Illinois legislator who sponsored the bill to create the County. The County adopted the township form of government on November 8, 1859. Currently, the County Board is comprised of 11 districts, with two members representing each district, for a total of 22 County Board Members. The County Board elects a County Board Chair from among its members by a majority vote at the biennial organizational meeting on the first Monday of December of every even-numbered year.

The County's population for the 2010 Census was 201,081, representing growth of 11.9% since the 2000 Census. This places Champaign County as the 10th largest county in the State of Illinois.
