Dear Ms. Fortado:

Thank you again for your time and for the County Board's concern regarding the elimination of the SNAP-Education Program (SNAP-Ed). I am grateful for the thoughtful conversation with you and Director of Administration at Champaign, Michelle Jett.

The potential loss of this program is more than just a funding issue; it represents a loss of vital support for families and social service agencies in Champaign County, who rely on SNAP-Ed to build healthier futures. Without this program, many of our most vulnerable neighbors, children, seniors, and working families will be left without the tools and resources they depend on to put nutritious food on the table.

The federal funding cuts, totaling \$785,000 and ending in February 2026, also mean the loss of dedicated staff positions in Champaign County. These educators build trusted relationships with families, teach in our schools, and support local food pantries and health partners. Preserving these jobs not only protects the livelihood of local employees but also ensures that their skills and commitment continue serving our community rather than being lost to budget cuts.

We are actively seeking long-term partnerships and creative funding solutions, but in the immediate future, we urgently need local support to bridge the gap. We respectfully request consideration of \$125,000 to allow Extension to continue providing critical services and to preserve local jobs while we work toward sustainable alternatives. Each local dollar provided is amplified by an 85% state match, multiplying the impact of your investment in families and workers in Champaign County.
