- **Re:** FY2025 Section 5311 Rural Public Transportation and Downstate Operating Assistance Program (DOAP) Applications for Champaign County Area Rural Transit System (C-CARTS)

**Requested Action:** Approve the Resolutions Authorizing Execution and Amendment of Section 5311 Grant Agreement and Illinois Downstate Operating Assistance Program (DOAP), Champaign County Public Transportation Ordinance, and Acceptance of Special Warranty as part of the Federal and State grant applications for Fiscal Year 2025 continued operation of Champaign County Area Rural Transit System (C-CARTS).

**Background:** To continue to receive rural public transportation operating funding, Champaign County is required to submit grant applications annually for FTA section 5311 (Rural Public Transportation) and IL Downstate Operating Assistance Program (DOAP). These grants are awarded based on the Illinois Department of Transportation's (IDOT) Fiscal Year (July 1, 2024 - June 30, 2025). The separate applications were prepared by RPC staff with input from Champaign-Urbana Mass Transit District staff and will be submitted online.

#### FY25 SECTION 5311 AND DOAP GRANT APPLICATION BUDGET

Allocated federal funding for FY2025 is \$ 177,721, while the allocated DOAP state funding is \$1,125,600. Total available funding is \$1,303,321; however, the amount of DOAP funding that Champaign County and its operator can obtain will depend on their ability to source local match funding. The FY2025 budget is based on FY 2024 budget and projected expenses and applied known changes for FY25 and increase the remaining lines by a standard 3% inflation rate. One additional item added to this budget under "local contributions" was the potential of providing transportation for individuals receiving treatment for opioid addiction. Also, additional funding was allocated under "Other special fare assistance" for additional local contracts. The amount of DOAP funding requested is \$1,042,865. This means the total federal and state request for FY2025 is \$1,518,500.

#### RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTION AND AMENDMENT OF SECTION 5311 GRANT AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the provision of public transit service is essential to the transportation of persons in the nonurbanized area; and

WHEREAS, 49 U.S.C. § 5311 ("Section 5311"), makes funds available to the State of Illinois to help offset certain operating deficits and administrative expenses of a system providing public transit service in non-urbanized areas; and

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois, acting by and through the Illinois Department of Transportation, is authorized by 30 ILCS 740/3-1 *et seq*. to provide the Section 5311 grant; and

WHEREAS, grants for said funds will impose certain obligations upon the recipient, including the provision by it of the local share of funds necessary to cover costs not covered by funds provided under Section 5311.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BOARD OF CHAMPAIGN COUNTY :

Section 1. That an application be made to the Office of Intermodal Project Implementation, Department of Transportation, State of Illinois, for a financial assistance grant under Section 5311 for fiscal year 2025 for the purpose of off- setting a portion of the Public Transportation Program operating deficits of Champaign County.

Section 2. That while participating in said operating assistance program, Champaign County will provide all required local matching funds.

Section 3. That the Champaign County Executive is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file on behalf of such application.

Section 4. That the Champaign County Executive is authorized to furnish such additional information as may be required by the Office of Intermodal Project Implementation and the Federal Transit Administration in connection with the aforesaid application for said grant.

Section 5. That the Champaign County Executive is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file on behalf of the a Section 5311 Grant Agreement ("Agreement") with the Illinois Department of Transportation, and amend such Agreement, if necessary, in order to obtain grant assistance under the provisions of Section 5311 for fiscal year 2025.

Section 6. That the Champaign County Executive is hereby authorized to provide such information and to file such documents as may be required to perform the Agreement and to receive the grant for fiscal year 2025.

## **Public Transportation Applicant Ordinance**

ORDINANCE NUMBER:

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE PUBLIC TRANSPORTATIO IN CHAMPAIGN COUNTY, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, public transportation is an essential public purpose for which public funds may be expended under Article 13, Section 7 of the Illinois Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the wishes to provide public transportation for its citizens and become eligible for grants from the State of Illinois or any department or agency thereof, from any unit of local government, from the Federal government or any department or agency thereof; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Champaign County Executive and the Champaign County Board that:

Section 1. Champaign County shall hereby provide public transportation within the county or counties limits.

Section 2. The clerk/secretary to the governing board of Champaign County shall file a certified copy of this Ordinance, within sixty days after passage of this ordinance.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval, as required by law.

Section 4. That the Champaign County Executive is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file on behalf of Champaign County a Grant Application to the Illinois Department of Transportation.

Section 5. That the Champaign County Executive is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file on behalf of Champaign County all required Grant Agreements with the Illinois Department of Transportation.

## Acceptance of the Special Warranty

WHEREAS, Section 5311 of the Federal Transit Act of 1964, as amended, makes funds available to help offset certain operating deficits of a system providing public transit service in non-urbanized areas; and

WHEREAS, 49 U.S.C. § 5333(b) requires that fair and equitable arrangements must be made to protect the interests of employees affected by such assistance as a condition of receipt of funds under Section 5311; and

WHEREAS a simplified process for assuring employee protections that accommodates the needs of participants in the Section 5311 program has been agreed upon by the U.S. Department of Labor and the U.S. Department of Transportation by allowing execution of a Special Section 5333(b) Warranty for Section 5311 projects (Special Warranty), which the Secretary of Labor certified on May 31, 1979;

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BOARD OF CHAMPAIGN COUNTY :

Section 1. That an application be made to the Office of Intermodal Project Implementation, Department of Transportation, State of Illinois, for a financial assistance grant under Section 5311 of the Federal Transit Act of 1964, as amended.

Section 2. As a condition of the receipt of Section 5311 funds, Champaign County hereby agrees in writing to the terms and conditions of the Special Warranty (attached) regarding fair and equitable arrangements to protect the interests of employees affected by such assistance.

#### AUTHORIZING EXECUTION AND AMENDMENT OF DOWNSTATE OPERATING ASSISTANCE AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the provision of public transit service is essential to the people of Illinois; and

**WHEREAS,** the Downstate Public Transportation Act (30 ILCS 740/2-1 et seq.) (Act), authorizes the State of Illinois, acting by and through the Illinois Department ('DEPARTMENT"), to make fund available to assist in the development and operation of public transportation systems; and

**WHEREAS,** awards for said funds will impose certain obligations upon Champaign County, including the provision of the local share of funds necessary to cover costs not covered by funds provided under the Downstate Public Transportation Act.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF CHAMPAIGN COUNTY:

Section 1. Champaign County enter into a Downstate Public Transportation Operating Assistance Agreement (Agreement) with the State of Illinois and amend such Agreement, if necessary, for fiscal year 2025 in order to obtain assistance under the provisions of the Act.

Section 2. That the County Executive is hereby authorized and directed to execute the Agreement or its amendments(s) on behalf of Champaign County for such assistance for fiscal year 2025.

Section 3. That the County Executive of Champaign County is hereby authorized to provide such information and file such documents as may be required to perform the Agreement and to request and receive the funding for fiscal year 2025.

Section 4. That while participating in said operating assistance program Champaign County shall provide all required local matching funds.

#### PETITION REQUESTING AND RESOLUTION APPROVING APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS FROM THE COUNTY BRIDGE FUND PURSUANT TO 605 ILCS 5/5-501

#### PETITION

Petitioner, David Stalter, hereby requests an appropriation of funds from the Champaign County Bridge Fund pursuant to 605 ILCS 5/5-501. In support of this petition, Petitioners states the following:

1. Petitioner is the duly elected Highway Commissioner for the <u>Brown</u> Road Districts, Champaign County, Illinois; and

2. There is a <u>Bridge</u> located on County Road 3400N between Section 12 and Section 13 in <u>Brown</u> Township over the Sangamon Rover, which is in poor condition; and

3. To ensure the adequacy of said structure for the traveling public, it is necessary that said bridge deck be replaced; and

4. The cost to <u>replace</u> the aforesaid bridge deck is estimated to be \$600,000 which will be more than .02% of the value of all the taxable property in the <u>Brown</u> Road District, as equalized or assessed by the Department of Revenue; and

5. The tax rate for road purposes in the <u>Brown</u> Road District was in each year for the last two (2) years not less than the maximum allowable rate provided for in Section 6-501 of the Illinois Highway Code (605 ILCS 5/6-501); and

6. The <u>Brown</u> Road District is prepared to pay 50% of the local cost for construction and 50% of the local cost for engineering associated with the replacement of said structure.

#### **RESOLUTION NO.**

WHEREAS, the County Board finds that based on the representations in the foregoing Petition, it is required pursuant to 605 ILCS 5/5-501 to provide the requested aid.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of Champaign County as follows:

1. The County Board hereby appropriates from the County Bridge Fund a sufficient sum to meet 50% of the local cost of engineering and 50% of the local cost of construction to replace the deck of the aforesaid structure.

2. The County Board hereby directs the County Engineer to cause plans and specifications to be prepared for said improvement.

3. The County Board hereby orders that said improvement be made under the general supervision of the County Engineer, by receiving bids for the improvements.

4. The County Board hereby directs the County Engineer to certify to the County Board when the work has been satisfactorily completed to meet his approval. Such certificate shall include an itemized account of the cost of all items of work incurred in the completion of said improvement and shall show the division of cost between the County and the <u>Brown</u> Road District.

5. The County Board further directs the County Engineer to file said certificate with the clerk of the <u>Brown</u> Road District.

6. This Resolution shall become effective upon its adoption.





#### INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE VILLAGE OF SAVOY AND THE COUNTY OF CHAMPAIGN FOR PROJECT FUNDING

This Intergovernmental Agreement (hereinafter "Agreement") is effective as of [Insert Date] and is entered into by and between the Village of Savoy, a home rule Illinois municipal corporation and body politic (hereinafter "Village") and the County of Champaign, a body corporate and politic (hereinafter "County"), collectively referred to as "Parties".

#### RECITALS

WHEREAS, Article VII Section 10 of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois authorizes Village and the County to contract to perform and share services in any manner not prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, 65 ILCS 5/11-91.2-1 and 605 ILCS 5/5-102, 5-105, 5-408, 5-410, 5-410.1, 7-101 and 9-101, all provide statutory authority for the Village and the County to enter into this cooperative agreement with respect to the jurisdiction, maintenance, design, and construction of roads and streets; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village and the County have a responsibility to provide for an adequate roadway system for the travelling public and desire to work collaboratively to perform this function as efficiently and effectively as possible; and

WHEREAS, improvement of the Curtis Road corridor, between Prospect Avenue to First Street, along with construction of a grade separation structure at the crossing of Curtis Road and the Canadian National/Illinois Central Railroad Corridor, and associated rail track realignment, has been jointly planned and advocated by the Village and the County for several decades; and

WHEREAS, improved roadways and creation of a grade separation rail crossing will provide for improved emergency response and economic vitality, at benefit to both parties, and the entire region, and

**WHEREAS**, the Village successfully was awarded over \$22.6M in federal funds to complete the Curtis Road Grade Separation and Complete Streets Project, in part thanks to generous and continuous support from the County; and

WHEREAS, other State and local government partners and community stakeholders have committed funding to the Curtis Road Grade Separation and Complete Streets Project; and

**WHEREAS**, the County desires to formalize its funding commitment to the Curtis Road Grade Separation and Complete Streets Project, as outlined in the successful grant award, as further enumerated in this Agreement. **NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

<u>Section 1. Incorporation of Recitals.</u> The recitals of this Agreement are deemed accurate and true and are hereby incorporated into this Section as if set out herein in full.

#### Section 2. Definitions.

- (a) "Jurisdiction" means the authority and responsibility to administer, control, construct, maintain and operate all elements of the area within the right-of-way (ROW) of a road highway, including within any permanent and temporary construction easements associated with said responsibilities.
- (b) "Maintenance" means the performance of all activities necessary to keep a highway in serviceable condition for vehicular traffic.
- (c) "ROW" means land or interest therein acquired for or devoted to a highway, including any easements for the purposes of administering said highway.
- (d) "Highway" means and public way for the purposes of conveying multiple modes of transportation, including pedestrians, bicycles, and vehicles, which has been laid out in pursuance of any law of this State. The term "highway" includes ROW, pavements, curbs, parkways, sidewalks, bikeways, drainage structures, channels, stormwater conveyance and management systems, signs, traffic signals, protective structures and all other structures and appurtenances necessary or convenient for conveyance of multiple modes of transportation as described herein.

"Expense" includes costs for general services such as appraisers, ROW agents, attorneys, engineers, and other consultants; and costs for the procurement of the required materials, equipment, and labor for specific items or activities; as necessary for the completion of the project.

(e) "Project" is defined as services, materials, equipment, and labor required to complete the construction of Curtis Road Grade Separation and Complete Streets Project from Prospect Avenue to First Street, including the construction of a grade separation structure as set forth in Exhibit "A."

<u>Section 3. Lead Agency.</u> The Village shall serve as the Lead Agency for the Project; managing the procurement of all professional services and construction, as needed to provide for the completion of the Project in its entirety.

<u>Section 4. Phases.</u> The Project shall be completed in phases in accordance with Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) accepted terminology.

- (a) Phase I includes preliminary design engineering activities such as historical, cultural, environmental, and biological assessment and compliance, traffic studies, noise abatement studies, development of project alignment, geographical limits, and the determination of vertical as well as horizontal geometry, assessment of ROW needs, as well as preliminary opinion of probable costs.
- (b) Phase II work includes final design to include development of final design plans, project estimate, preparation of ROW acquisition documents, ROW acquisition costs and all other costs associated with preparing the project for an IDOT Letting (IDOT bid process).
- (c) Phase III costs include all construction related costs including procurement of labor, equipment, materials, and services as needed to construct the Project including construction engineering services as required by IDOT to construct the Project.

<u>Section 5. General Responsibilities Assigned to the Village.</u> In addition to serving as Lead Agency, the Village also agrees to manage the work of the service providers and consultants, as needed, and to administer any grants related to the Project. The Village, working with and through their service providers, shall manage and complete all ROW acquisition required to build and maintain the Project.

<u>Section 6. General Responsibilities Assigned to County.</u> The County shall provide for the necessary administrative actions necessary to provide for the funding and execution of timely payments for costs of services rendered for the completion of Phase III of the work as outlined herein.

<u>Section 7. Descriptions, Responsibilities, Schedule, and Costs.</u> Attached hereto, as Exhibits A through D, are detailed project description, project maps, an anticipated project schedule, and an outline of project costs. The Village shall pay for the entirety of the Phase I and Phase II project engineering costs. The Village and the County shall share in the costs of Phase III. The County share of the construction funding shall be \$862,500. The Village will pay for the remaining local share of the project construction costs. While Village costs may vary based on the actual project cost, the County share will not increase.

<u>Section 8. Invoices and Reimbursement Procedures.</u> IDOT will award and administer all contracts utilizing Federal and or State funds and invoice the Village for the local share of the project costs. After receiving each invoice from IDOT, the Village will subsequently invoice the County for twenty percent of the invoice, until such time as the \$862,500 County share has been realized. Upon request, the Village shall provide the reasonable and appropriate documentation regarding the actual cost of the Project, as related to the County's share. Reimbursement payments shall be made by the County to the Village in accordance with 50 ILCS 505, "Local Government Prompt Payment Act".

<u>Section 9. Jurisdiction and Maintenance.</u> The maintenance and jurisdictional responsibilities for the constructed improvements from Prospect Avenue to First Street along the Curtis Road corridor shall be the responsibility of the Village. IDOT will continue to maintain jurisdiction of the U.S. Route 45 corridor, and Canadian National Railroad will continue to maintain jurisdiction of the railroad corridor. The County shall not have any maintenance responsibilities, nor shall the County have any jurisdictional responsibilities for the resulting improvements.

<u>Section 10. Assignment.</u> This Agreement shall be binding on the Parties and their respective successors and assigns, provided however, that neither Party may assign this Agreement, or any obligations imposed hereunder, without the prior written consent of the other Party.

<u>Section 11. Confidentiality and Ownership of Documents.</u> In the performance of the Project, the Village and the County may have access to certain information, belonging to the other Party, which is not generally known to others ("Confidential Information"). Both Parties agree not to use or disclose to any third party, except as required by court order or applicable law, any Confidential Information or any records, reports, or documents prepared or generated because of this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other Party. The terms of this section shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

Section 12. Termination. If Phase III work has not commenced by January 1, 2030, either party may declare its intent to withdraw from this Agreement with ninety (90) days written notice. Upon receipt of such written notice, and substantively prior to the expiration of the ninety (90) day notice period, the Parties shall meet to identify and, to the best of their ability, to resolve cause for the delay; mutually agreeing to a plan for a resolution which allows the Project to continue. If a plan of resolution is not accepted by the Parties within ninety (90) days of the written notice of intent to withdraw from this Agreement, either Party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement. Upon such termination, the future liabilities of the Parties to this Agreement shall cease, but they shall not be relieved of the duty to perform their obligations up to the date of termination, or to pay for deliverables tendered prior to termination. There shall be no termination expenses.

<u>Section 13. Entire Agreement and Amendment.</u> This Agreement, including all exhibits and referenced documents, constitutes the entire Agreement of the Parties with respect to the matters contained herein. All attached exhibits are incorporated into and made a part of this Agreement. No modification of or amendment to this Agreement shall be effective unless such modification or amendment is in writing and signed by both Parties hereto. Any prior agreements or representations, either written or oral, relating to the subject matter of this Agreement are of no force or effect.

Section 14. Notices. All notices required under this Agreement shall be in writing and sent to the addresses and persons set forth below, or to such other addresses as may be designated by a party in writing. All notices shall be deemed received when (i) delivered personally; (ii) sent by confirmed telex or facsimile (followed by the actual document); or (iii) one (1) day after deposit with a commercial express courier specifying next day delivery, with written verification of receipt.

#### EXHIBIT A PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Length & Width: Four through lanes with center turn lane roadway with approximately 150 feet of right-of-way, with a Total Length of approximately 6,715 feet.

<u>Highway Components:</u> This project will include design, acquisition of all ROW, excavation, and embankment as necessary to build the project. The project will also include required utility relocations, pavement construction, installation of drainage structures and facilities, signage, and traffic signals at the intersection of Curtis Road and U.S. Route 45 as well as intersection improvements, landscaping, and roadway lighting along the corridor.

<u>Grade Separation Structure</u>: The project will include design, right-of-way acquisition, utility relocations, and construction activities as necessary to construct a railroad grade separation structure with rail being routed over the roadway at the intersection of Curtis Road and the Canadian National/Illinois Central railroad. The grade separation structure work will also include track realignment and railroad embankment work as necessary to construct the grade separation structure. The realignment and rail embankment work is anticipated to occur between limits of Church Street and Winsor Road.



#### AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF CURTIS ROAD BETWEEN THE CITY OF CHAMPAIGN, VILLAGE OF SAVOY, AND THE COUNTY OF CHAMPAIGN

THIS INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT is entered into by and between the City of Champaign, a municipal corporation ("City"), the Village of Savoy, Illinois, a municipal corporation ("Savoy"); and the County of Champaign, Illinois ("County").

WHEREAS, Article VII Section 10 of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois authorizes the City, Savoy, and the County to contract to perform and share services in any manner not prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, 65 ILCS 5/11-91.2-1 and 605 ILCS 5/5-102, 5-105, 5-408, 5-410, 5-410.1, 7-101 and 9-101, all provide statutory authority for the City, Savoy, and the County to enter into this cooperative agreement with respect to the jurisdiction and maintenance of road and streets; and

WHEREAS, the responsibility to provide for a highway system rests with the City, Savoy, the County and the State; and

WHEREAS, the City, Savoy and the County desire to perform this function as efficiently and effectively as possible thereby reducing costs to taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, Curtis Road west of First Street will provide a necessary major transportation link across the south side of the community; and

WHEREAS, the City, Savoy, and the County find it to be in the best interest of the public to construct the section of Curtis Road from Staley Road to First Street according to the location

study that will be completed for this road and approved by the Illinois Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, the City, Savoy and the County find it appropriate to share the responsibilities and costs as provided in Exhibits A through G in this agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City, Savoy, and the County, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, agree as follows:

#### Paragraph 1. Definitions.

- (a) "Jurisdiction" means the authority and responsibility to administer, control, construct, maintain and operate all elements of the area within the right-of-way of a highway.
   Permanent and temporary construction easements are included in ROW.
- (b) "Maintenance" means the performance of all activities necessary to keep a highway in serviceable condition for vehicular traffic.
- (c) "Right-of-way" or "ROW" means the land or interest therein acquired for or devoted to a highway. Permanent easements and temporary construction easements are included in ROW.
- (d) "Highway" means any public way for vehicular travel, which has been laid out in pursuance of any law of this State. The term "highway" includes rights-of-way, curbs, sidewalks, bikeways, bridges, drainage structures, channels and detention basins, signs, traffic signals, guard rails, protective structures and all other structures and appurtenances necessary or convenient for vehicular or pedestrian traffic.

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- (e) "Direct expenses" include costs for appraisers, ROW agents, attorneys, and other direct expenses necessary for the completion of the project.
- (f) "Resident Engineer" is a Professional Engineer appointed by the lead agency for a project. The duties of the Resident Engineer are described in the IDOT Road and Bridge Specifications.

Paragraph 2. Projects. "Project A" is defined as the work required to complete construction of Curtis Road from Staley Road to Duncan Road as set forth in Exhibit "A".

"Project B" is defined as the work required to complete construction of Curtis Road from Duncan Road to Wynstone Drive as set forth in Exhibit "B".

"Project C" is defined as the work required to complete construction of Curtis Road from Wynstone Drive to US 45 as set forth in Exhibit "C".

"Project D" is defined as the work required to complete construction of Curtis Road from US 45 to First Street as set forth in Exhibit "D".

"Project E" is defined as the work required to complete construction of the grade separation of Curtis Road and the Illinois Central/Canadian National Railroad.

**Paragraph 3. Lead Agency.** The City shall be the lead local agency for Projects A, B, and C and the County will be the lead agency for Project D and E.

Paragraph 4. Phases. Each project will be completed in phases. For Projects A - D, Phase 1 will include design engineering, acquisition of all right-of-way, excavation, embankment work, utility relocations, and drainage structures and facilities for a four-lane road. Phase 2 will include construction engineering and paving for the center two lanes of Curtis Road and

installation of signs and traffic signals. Phase 3 will include construction of the outside two lanes of Curtis road.

For Project E, Phase 1 will include design engineering, acquisition of all right of way, and major utility relocation for a four-lane grade separation. Phase 2 will include construction engineering, excavation, embankment work, paving, drainage structures and facilities for a fourlane grade separation, relocation of railroad tracks and a bridge, and installation of signs.

#### Paragraph 5. Engineering and Other Services.

n., ...

- (a) Consulting Engineer. A Qualifications Based Selection process was used to select the consulting Engineer, Clark Dietz, to complete the location study. The parties intend to negotiate a contract with the same Engineer to prepare plans, specifications and estimates (PS&E) and construction engineering for Projects B-E. IDOT will be the Engineer for Project A. The Engineer selected for PS&E and construction engineering shall not be an employee of any of the parties. The City is the lead agency that will contract with the Engineer for Phase 2 of Projects B and C. Prior to entering into such contracts, the City shall obtain prior written approval from the other parties for the scope of work to be performed by the Engineer and the terms of the contract. The County will contract, the County shall obtain prior written approval from Savoy for the scope of work to be performed by the Engineer and the terms of the contract.
- (b) <u>Resident Engineer & Construction Inspection.</u> The lead agency will provide a Resident Engineer for the construction phase that shall be an employee of the lead agency. The lead agency may provide additional construction inspection staff from the employees of

the lead agency if not included in a contract with a private engineering firm to perform supplemental engineering services during the construction phase.

(c) Other Professional Services. The lead agency shall select and contract with other professionals necessary or desirable for the completion of the project including, but not limited to, title companies, real estate appraisals, right-of-way agents, and attorneys. Direct expenses, including but not limited to legal, title, real estate appraisal, right-of-way agent, soils and material testing services and other professional services expense associated with administering, managing, applying for grants, engineering or acquiring right-of-way for the project shall be eligible for reimbursement under the cost share provisions in this agreement and Exhibits A through G. However, prior to entering into any contract for necessary professional services, the lead agency shall provide a good faith estimate of the cost and a description of such services to the other parties. The cost will not exceed such estimates without the written approval of the other effected parties. Paragraph 6. Implementation.

- (a) <u>Timing.</u> The City, Savoy, and the County agree to take all necessary steps to implement the project and perform those activities set forth in Exhibits A through G hereto, which is incorporated herein by reference. It is the intent of the parties to complete the Phase 1 work for Projects A-E in 2005. Phase 2, the construction, should be completed as follows: Project A, 2007; Project B, 2006; Project C, 2009; Project D, 2011; and Project E, 2012.
- (b) <u>City Budgeting; Savoy Budgeting; County Appropriations.</u> The financial shares of the City, Savoy, and County shall be as set forth in Exhibits A through G for Phase 1 and Phase 2 improvements for Projects A-E. The City, Savoy, and County agree to budget or

appropriate amounts sufficient to meet their commitments for paying their respective share of the balance of the local costs as set forth herein.

(c) <u>Eminent Domain.</u>

- 1. At the written request of the lead agency, the party in whose jurisdiction the real property required for the project ("subject property") lies ("jurisdictional entity") shall take such action as necessary to exercise its right of eminent domain over the subject property. The jurisdictional entity shall exercise its right of eminent domain over the subject property, if necessary, by passage of appropriate and effective authorizing legislation as soon as practical after the receipt of the aforementioned written request.
- 2. If the County is the jurisdictional entity that needs to exercise its eminent domain powers, then the Champaign County State's Attorney will perform the necessary legal work for eminent domain action or will appoint the City Attorney as a Special Assistant State's Attorney to perform the necessary legal work for eminent domain action.
- (d) <u>Phase 3.</u> Phase 3 will be completed when warranted by traffic and agreed to by the parties. Issues involving project scope, schedule, lead agency responsibility, and cost shares for Phase 3 will be negotiated and included in a separate agreement.

### Paragraph 7. Jurisdictional Transfer.

(a) Subject to subsection (b), the City will have jurisdiction and maintain the road from Staley Road to a point ¼ mile east of Mattis Avenue after completion of the Phase 2 projects and completion of the jurisdictional transfer process. Savoy will have jurisdiction and maintain the road from a point ¼ mile east of Mattis Avenue to First Street and the grade separation structure after completion of Phase 2 projects and completion of the jurisdictional transfer process.

- (b) As provided by statute, the City, Savoy and the County shall exercise reasonable efforts to submit such documentation to the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) so as to secure approval by IDOT of any transfer of jurisdiction agreed to by the parties herein. Such submissions shall be generally in accordance with IDOT's "Jurisdictional Transfer Guidelines for Highway and Streets Systems," dated April 1993 or any such successors document.
- (c) Until the roadway is annexed to the City or Savoy as the case may be, the jurisdictional transfer shall not effect a transfer of the provision of police and fire services for the particular segment of the highway.

#### Paragraph 8. Further Actions.

- (a) The City, Savoy, and the County hereby agree to take any official action necessary to accomplish any of the undertakings set forth in this agreement, including the passage of legally sufficient resolutions or ordinances, appropriation of money, the execution of any and all documents necessary to evidence jurisdictional transfers and any and all other undertakings set forth in this Agreement. The Mayor and City Manager of the City, the Mayor and Village Administrator of Savoy, and the Champaign County Board Chair and County Engineer are hereby authorized by the approval of this Agreement by the respective governing bodies of the City, Savoy, and the County to execute any such documents necessary to carry out the terms of this Agreement.
- (b) Time is of the essence of this Agreement.

Paragraph 9. Descriptions, Responsibilities, Estimates and Cost Shares. Attached hereto as Exhibits A through G are descriptions of the Project and responsibilities, estimates, and cost shares. Exhibits A through G are a substantial basis for the entry into this agreement by the parties. The cost estimates represent the year 2000 dollars. Actual costs will vary depending on the final design and inflationary increases due to the timing of the construction.

Paragraph 10. Other Money; Grants. Any other grant or reimbursement funds for design, land acquisition, or construction including but not limited to funds received for the project from the Illinois Commerce Commission, Illinois Department of Transportation, State or Federal Governments, developers, or other parties or agencies will be used to lower the local shares of the cost.

**Paragraph 11. Maps.** Attached hereto as Exhibit F is a map of which the parties agree is the section of highway subject to the provisions of this Agreement.

**Paragraph 12. Cooperation.** The City, Savoy, and the County agree to reasonably cooperate to allow the Engineer selected to commence work by January 1, 2004.

Paragraph 13. Invoices. IDOT shall award all contracts utilizing Federal Funds, make all payments to the construction contractor from Federal and State funds, and invoice the lead agency for the local share of the construction costs. The lead agency shall invoice the other responsible parties in accordance with cost shares and payment limits described in this agreement and Exhibits A through G. The lead agency shall invoice the other responsible parties for costs after receipt of invoice for payment, which is due and payable. Upon request, the lead agency shall provide reasonable documentation to the other responsible parties regarding the actual cost of the work. Reimbursement payments shall be made to the lead agency within thirty (30) days of the date the party receives an invoice for its share of the cost.

Paragraph 14. Effective Date of Agreement. The Agreement shall be effective, as between the City, Savoy and the County, when the Agreement is approved by the last of the City Council, Village Board, or the County Board.

<u>Paragraph 15. Effective Date of Jurisdictional Transfers.</u> The effective date of any jurisdictional transfer indicated in Exhibits A through G shall be as indicated therein.

Paragraph 16. Termination. If the Consulting Engineer has not commenced work by January 1, 2004, any party may declare its intent to withdraw from this agreement with ninety (90) days written notice. Upon receipt of such written notice and prior to the expiration of ninety (90) days, the parties shall meet to identify and, to the best of their ability, resolve the cause for delay or develop a plan for resolution to allow the project to continue. If the cause for delay is within the control of the parties and is not resolved or a plan for resolution is not accepted by all parties within ninety (90) days of the written notice of intent to withdraw from this agreement, all benefits and obligations contained herein shall be null and void as to the declaring party after the ninety (90) days has elapsed.

<u>Paragraph 17. Amendment.</u> No amendment to this Agreement shall be effective unless it is in writing and signed by the parties hereto.

<u>Paragraph 18. Notices.</u> Notice with respect to any matter contained herein shall be sent first class and mailed to:

## EXHIBIT A PROJECT A - CURTIS ROAD, STALEY ROAD TO DUNCAN ROAD

Length & Width: Four-lane roadway with approximately 150' right-of-way.

Total length = approximately 5280 ft.

<u>Highway Components</u>: Phases 1 and 2 will include design, acquisition of all right-of-way for roadway, excavation, and embankment work for four lanes, interchange with Interstate 57, utility relocations, paving for the center two lanes, drainage structures and facilities, signage, and traffic signals at the Staley Road intersection, and intersection lighting. Phase 3 will include widening to four lanes at a future date.

#### Cost Estimate:

19. j. - 11.

It is anticipated that IDOT will complete the design and will construct the I-57 interchange and part of Curtis Road approaching the interchange from Staley Road to Duncan Road. There will be a local share of the cost that can be paid with STP-U funds and local agencies will be responsible for the remaining costs. Phases 1 and 2 (engineering, ROW, and all earthwork, construct center two lanes, other professional services, and direct expenses) = approximately \$2,200,000.

<u>Cost Share</u>: It is anticipated that 50% of the construction and utility relocation cost will be paid with Federal STP-U funds, approximately \$1,000,000. The City and the County will share equally in the local share of the Phase 1 and Phase 2 costs not paid with Federal, State, or other grant or reimbursement funds, approximately \$1,200,000. The City and County will each pay for the remaining local share for the part of the project within their jurisdiction as described below, approximately \$600,000 for Champaign and \$600,000 for the County.

<u>Jurisdiction and Maintenance</u>: The City will have jurisdiction and maintain the road upon completion of the Phase 2 project. The same jurisdiction will remain after Phase 3.

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#### EXHIBIT B PROJECT B - CURTIS ROAD, DUNCAN ROAD TO WYNSTONE DRIVE

Length & Width: Four-lane roadway with approximately 150' right-of-way.

Total length = approximately 2640 ft.

<u>Highway Components</u>: Phases 1 and 2 will include design, acquisition of all right-of-way for roadway, excavation, and embankment work for four lanes, utility relocations, paving for the center two lanes, drainage structures and facilities, signage, and traffic signals at the Duncan intersection, and intersection lighting. Phase 3 will include widening to four lanes at a future date.

#### Cost Estimate:

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Phases 1 and 2 (engineering, ROW, and all earthwork, construct center two lanes, other professional services, and direct expenses) = approximately \$2,997,858.

<u>Cost Share</u>: It is anticipated that 50% of the construction and utility relocation cost will be paid with Federal STP-U funds, approximately \$1,056,191. The City and County will share equally the remaining local share of the Phase 1 and Phase 2 costs not paid with Federal or other grant or reimbursement funds, approximately \$970,834 each

<u>Jurisdiction and Maintenance</u>: The City will have jurisdiction and maintain the road upon completion of the Phase 1 and Phase 2 project. The same jurisdiction will remain after Phase 3.

### EXHIBIT C PROJECT C - CURTIS ROAD, WYNSTONE DRIVE TO US ROUTE 45

Length & Width: Four-lane roadway with approximately 150' right-of-way.

Total length = approximately 10000 ft.

<u>Highway Components</u>: Phase 1 and Phase 2 will include design, acquisition of all right-of-way for roadway, excavation, and embankment work for four lanes, utility relocations, paving for the center two lanes, drainage structures and facilities, signage, and traffic signals at Prospect, Mattis, and US Route 45 intersections, and intersection lighting. Phase 3 will include widening to four lanes at a future date.

#### Cost Estimate:

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Phases 1 and 2 (engineering, ROW, and all earthwork, construct center two lanes, other professional services, and direct expenses) = approximately \$5,864,606.

<u>Cost Share</u>: It is anticipated that 50% of the construction and utility relocation cost will be paid with Federal STP-U funds, approximately \$2,236,919. The County will pay 50% of the remaining local share of the Phase 1 and Phase 2 costs not paid with Federal or other grant or reimbursement funds, approximately \$1,813,844. The City and Savoy will each pay for the remaining local share for the part of the project within their jurisdiction as described below, approximately \$851,700 for Champaign and \$962,142 for Savoy.

Jurisdiction and Maintenance: The City will have jurisdiction and maintain the road from Wynstone Drive to a point ¼ mile east of Mattis Avenue and Savoy will have jurisdiction and maintain the road from a point ¼ mile east of Mattis Avenue to Route 45 upon completion of the Phase 1 and Phase 2 projects. The same jurisdiction will remain after completion of the Phase 3 project.

## EXHIBIT D PROJECT D - CURTIS ROAD, US ROUTE 45 TO FIRST STREET

Length & Width: Four-lane roadway with approximately 150' right-of-way.

Total length = approximately 3320 ft.

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<u>Highway Components</u>: Phase 1 and Phase 2 will include design, acquisition of all right-of-way for roadway, excavation, and embankment work for four lanes, utility relocations, paving for the two lanes plus turn lanes, drainage structures and facilities, signage, and traffic signals at the First Street intersection, and intersection lighting.

<u>Cost Estimate</u>: Phase 1 and Phase 2 (engineering, ROW, and all earthwork, construct center two lanes, other professional services, and direct expenses) = approximately \$2,539,742.

<u>Cost Share</u>: It is anticipated that 50% of the construction and utility relocation cost will be paid with Federal STP-U Funds, approximately \$1,027,601. The County and Savoy will equally share the remaining local share of the Phase 1 costs, approximately \$756,071 each.

<u>Jurisdiction and Maintenance</u>: Savoy will have jurisdiction and maintain the road and grade separation structure from Route 45 to First Street upon completion of the Phase 1 and Phase 2 project. The same jurisdiction will remain after the Phase 3 project.

# **EXHIBIT E PROJECT E - CURTIS ROAD, GRADE SEPARATION STRUCTURE AT RAILROAD**

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
Length & Width: Bridge under Railroad with four lane roadway in approximately 150' right-of-way.

<u>Highway Components</u>: Phase 1 will include all design engineering, acquisition of all right-ofway for roadway and major utility relocation. Phase 2 will include all construction engineering, excavation, embankment for four lanes, paving for four lanes, drainage structures and facilities, relocation of the railroad tracks, bridge, and signage.

<u>Cost Estimate</u>: Phase 1 and Phase 2 (engineering, ROW, and all earthwork, construct four-lane grade separation, other professional services, and direct expenses) = approximately \$6,872,447. <u>Cost Share</u>: It is anticipated that 60% of the cost will be paid through a grant from the Interstate Commerce Commission (ICC), approximately \$4,123,468. Federal STP-U Funds will be used for 50% of the construction and utility relocation cost, approximately \$1,124,158. The County and Savoy will equally share the remaining local share of the Phase 1 and 2 costs, approximately \$812,411 each.

<u>Jurisdiction and Maintenance</u>: The Village of Savoy will have jurisdiction and maintain the grade separation upon completion of the Phases 1 and 2.
