MEETING MINUTES

I. Call to Order

Mr. Williams called the meeting to order at 3:25 p.m.

II. Roll Call

The roll was taken by sign in sheet. A guorum was declared present.

V. Approval of draft minutes from the February 26, 2025, RTAG meeting.

Ms. Beck made a motion to approve the draft minutes from the February 26, 2025, RTAG meeting. Mr. Esry seconded. Upon vote, the motion unanimously carried.

- VI. New Business
 - A. Introduction of new C-CARTS Manager
 - Ms. Woods introduced Sarah Love, the new C-CARTS Manager at MTD. Ms. Love provided background information to the members.
 - B. Presentation and approval of C-CARTS FY25 3rd Quarter (Jan-Mar) Service Report Emma Woods

Ms. Woods presented the Service Report with highlights:

- Decrease in shopping trips.
- Increase in lift use.

- Increase in Senior Trips.
- Demand Response trips only increased by 23 percent.
- Trip denials decreased.

Ms. Newton made a motion to approve the C-CARTS FY25 3rd Quarter (Jan-Mar) Service Report, seconded by Ms. Beck. Upon vote, the motion unanimously carried.

C. 5339B Vehicles update

- The grant for the vehicles was awarded back in 2019. C-CARTS was awarded three
 replacement buses and one expansion bus. The expansion bus was requested in order to
 try and accommodate some needs of Mahomet. The buses will be delivered next week.
- The last three buses C-CARTS received were picked up in March and were operating at the beginning of May.

D. Bus Inventory Update

- a) New Vehicles
 - The first vehicles received were from the FY 22 grant.
 - The 5339B grant for four vehicles will be arriving.
 - The next vehicle procurement notice of funding is coming out this summer. C-CARTS is hoping to get three replacements with that notice of funding.
 - There will be a total of 11 vehicles received.
- b) Vehicles to be dispose

Ms. Woods explained the federal process of disposing of vehicles once new vehicles are received.

E. Hiring updates (Sarah Love)

- There are two new full-time dispatchers who are in the fourth week of driving solo.
- One part-time dispatcher was hired and started Monday.
- There are currently ten drivers, and two are in training. Ms. Love is planning to hire one more driver. The total number of drivers will then be at 13.

F. Missing Rantoul bus stop signs

- Ms. Love researched and found that there was a minimum of 10-15 installed signs that are
 no longer in place. There is construction going on in Rantoul and it is possible they were
 removed due to construction and have not been reinstalled.
- There are a couple of other signs that may be relocated for better pickup locations.
- A meeting will be set up with the Village of Rantoul to discuss the missing signs.



Ms. Love discussed a program that is available on a tablet that tracks the vans. The cost would be \$27.00 per van per month. The software program includes a basic maintenance checkup. Ms. Morocoima-Black commented that at this time, it is not in the budget for this year but suggested there may be some grant funding available.

Denials are counted when a rider requests a trip that could not be accommodated.

Service miles are miles driven while riders are on the vehicle (excludes miles driven to and from the MTD garage).

Service hours are hours driven while riders are on the vehicle (excludes time spent driving to and from the MTD garage). Fare structure: 5311 trips that begin or end in the rural public service area cost \$5 each way. Riders aged 60 years and older are eligible for a \$2 one-way fare. Personal care assistants ride for free, and children aged 12 and under ride for \$1 each way. Trips that begin and end in Rantoul are \$2 each way, regardless of the rider's age.
