

"It is helpful to define the edges of Supported Living by saying as clearly as possible what it is not."





A LITTLE HISTORY

- Federal Government developed institutions to educate people with IDD to become 'productive' members of society.
- Over the years, institutions shifted from educational schools to custodial settings
- Functioned as locations of care and medical practice rather than education. And here is where IL got stuck.

ILLINOIS COMPARED TO OTHER STATES



- A disproportionate amount of allocated dollars goes to 'brick and mortar' and not services in the community.
- •Illinois has seven state-run institutions. Most states have none.
- •Institutions are the default placement in Illinois when there is no other option.

FEDERALLY FUNDED MODELS



Institutions

- State Operated Developmental Centers
- Est annual cost: \$350K per person

ICF-DD (Intermediate Care Facility for Developmentally Disabled)

Est annual cost: \$150K per person

WAIVER PROGRAMS



CILA (Community Integrated Living Arrangement)

- •Established in 1981, the model hasn't changed in 40 years.
- Needs based but not person centered
- •Group homes run by licensed providers
- •Est annual cost: \$80 100K
- •Rules and regulations have not been updated in 40 years.

Home Based Program

- Stipend 3 times x Social Security \$34K/year
- Intended to provide funds to keep loved one at home until moving into CILA
- •Not sufficient funds to create a person-centered self-directed life.
- •80% of individuals choosing Home-Based by default as no other options are available

WE ARE ADVOCATING FOR: A MORE FLEXIBLE AND PERSONALIZED PROGRAM



HOME BASED PROGRAM

- •Case management provided by ISC with large caseloads. Meetings are once a quarter.
- •PSWs are family members or individual family hires and trains
- •Monthly allotment of \$2900 provides 4 6 hours of support a day (5 days).

NEW PROGRAM

- •Robust, wrap around case management based on person-centered plan. Weekly, monthly and quarterly check-ins.
- Finding, hiring and training PSW part of case management.
- •New program should be needs based and consider multiple times throughout the day when support is required.

WE ARE ADVOCATING FOR: A MORE FLEXIBLE AND PERSONALIZED PROGRAM (PG 2)



HOME BASED PROGRAM

- •Transportation, nursing, emergency and employment support all must come from same monthly allotment.
- •No funding available for flexible programming in the day

NEW PROGRAM

- To allow for more flexibility
- •Needs should be a part of an overall needs-based funding program.
- •Individuals should be able to choose what programs, clases and community-based activities they want to attend, where and when.

STRONG PARENT VOICE NEEDED



Currently, the strongest unified voices oppose moving away from institutional and congregate living models, which is the most expensive option for the State.

We need to advocate with louder voices for community-based programs that yield evidence-based, positive outcomes.


