



One D.U.I. case was dropped due to a judicial termination.






Juvenile Delinquency Petitions Filed



Gender Demographics for Juvenile Admissions




Age Demographics for Juvenile Admissions




Restitution Ordered in New Juvenile Cases








Adult Intakes Completed




Gender Demographics for Adult Intakes





Age Demographics for Adult Intakes



Restitution Ordered in New Adult Cases




Breakdown of Adult Caseload at End of Reporting Periods
