System of Care is a spectrum of effective and community-based services and supports for children and youth with or at risk for [mental health] and related challenges and their families that is organized into a coordinated network builds meaning partnerships with families and youth and addresses their cultural and linguistic needs in order to help them to function better at home, in school, in the community, and through life.
