Matkovszki would 49 50 like to place a plaque at the Champaign County Courthouse on or around August 25, 2011 to start the plaque project. They were here to propose the idea to the County Board for its permission and 51 support. Roberts distributed some information about their proposal. They are trying to obtain 52 53 construction costs estimates for the plaques. Roberts and Matkovszki offered to answer any 54 questions. 55 56 Betz assumed they were not asking the County to come up with any money for the plaques. 57 Roberts said he was open to whatever is possible. The Arts Commission has some money for

57 Roberts said he was open to whatever is possible. The Arts Commission has some money for 58 plaques. They are really looking for permission to place a plaque or marker on County property. 59 They would appreciate it if the County can assist them with some money for the plaque. McGinty 60 asked about the proper procedure in making such a request. Busey and Betz agreed the request 61 would need to be sent to the Facilities Deputy Chair to be included on a meeting agenda. The next 62 meeting with Facilities will be on August 2, 2011 followed by the County Board meeting on August 63 18, 2011, unless the Board wanted to address this at the July 21<sup>st</sup> full Board meeting. Roberts said 64 he would appreciate this request being addressed sooner rather than later.

Matkovszki said their primary interest was in placing a plaque on or in front of the old
section of the Courthouse that Royer designed. Betz would want to converse with the Sheriff to
determine if he had any objections due to safety issues before making any determination. Betz
could not imagine the County Board objecting to a tasteful sign, but did not think the Board would
allocate any money for the plaque due to budget constraints.

- 72 Matkovszki said they also wanted a room or two to display a temporary exhibit in 73 association with the dedication of the plaques in August. Roberts imagined this could be placed in 74 the Lincoln Exhibit anteroom where the photos of Lincoln statues are now displayed. Busey 75 explained that is a temporary display in the area outside the Jury Assembly Room. She 76 recommended Roberts and Matkovszki put together a comprehensive request to present to the Board. It was not in this committee purview to grant such a request. Betz did not object to 77 including this request on the July 21st agenda. Roberts and Matkovszki agreed to get in contact with 78 79 Busey about their request for the Board agenda. Busey stated that Sheriff Walsh is responsible for 80 the Courthouse property and recommended Roberts and Matkovszki meet with him first.

## **CONTINUING REVIEW OF IDEAS & INITIATIVES**

83 84 The committee continued to proceed in its review of ideas and initiatives. McGinty 85 suggested rolling the first three ideas into one about a comprehensive plan. The committee 86 discussed the definition and development of a comprehensive plan, including challenges faced in 87 the past with zoning revisions. Betz felt the situation was impassible in regards implementing a comprehensive plan in this political climate. Ammons wanted to keep the comprehensive plan goal 88 89 as an ideal. The committee discussed the uniqueness of Champaign County and how this would 90 impact the development of a comprehensive plan. Betz suggested the County might need to hire an 91 outside entity to draft a comprehensive zoning ordinance that is then voted on by the County Board 92 because the process within the County is so fragmented and susceptible to various personalities and 93 interests which clash. The investments in the Land Resources Management Plan were discussed.

The committee agreed to consolidate the first several ideas into "Document and adopt a process for
 movement from vision/LRMP to development and adoption of a comprehensive plan."

97 Regarding the idea to write a county building code, the committee noted a building code 98 would be coming from the state within two years. Busey also questioned if the County had the 99 jurisdictional authority to enforce anything beyond what the state mandates and offered to refer that 100 question to legal counsel. The committee concurred with Busey.

Ammons wanted the committee to ask Pattsi Petrie to look into what she meant with her suggestions of a local food council and converting County campus land to a farm. These ideas could be included under the "sustainability – mainly towards "greening" goal. Busey said the first stop in considering converting part of the County East Campus to farmland would be the City of Urbana to see if the city would allow it. The committee discussed what the intention was in these suggestions. The committee agreed to delete the farming idea. The local food council idea was combined with the sustainability issue.

Betz noted Indiana and Michigan have abolished numerous drainage districts. He noted the attorneys who represent the drainage districts will be against any legislation consolidating drainage districts. Busey stated both cities are looking into storm water management right now. This would be an opportunity to talk about intergovernmental cooperation and community-wide solutions. The goal to "investigate intergovernmental agreements with municipalities to promote a complete design change to storm water management for this community" was agreed to by the committee.

117 The committee agreed with Betz's suggestion to delete the idea about making the MTD into 118 a county-wide system because there is a rural transit system. The committee agreed to end 119 discussion at this time and resume at the next meeting. 120
